This information is being shared with each resident following an improvement to Section 156 of the Building Safety Act 2022 (BSA) makes a number of amendments to the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 (FSO) to improve fire safety in all buildings regulated by the FSO.

Fire safety measures provided for the safety of any or all occupants

- An automatic fire detection and alarm system is installed throughout the premises.
- The fire alarm and detection system are tested and serviced.
- Emergency lighting is installed in all escape routes, this is serviced and tested.
- Emergency exit signage is installed throughout the premises.
- Appropriate fire extinguishers are installed throughout the premises and inspected annually.
- Self-closing fire doors are installed throughout the premises.
- The fire alarm is always monitored by the on-site security team (porters).
- Students receive instruction in what to do in the event of a fire on arrival at the college.
- Fire drills are held once a term in the academic year (per building).
- Suitable measures are taken to protect the premises from arson, this includes on site security, CCTV, and a secure site.
- Escape routes lead to a final exits, there are a sufficient number of escape routes and final exits and the distance to all final exits is acceptable.
- Suitable arrangements are in place for calling the fire service, this will be completed by the porters.
- Portable appliance testing is carried out on all electrical items as required.
